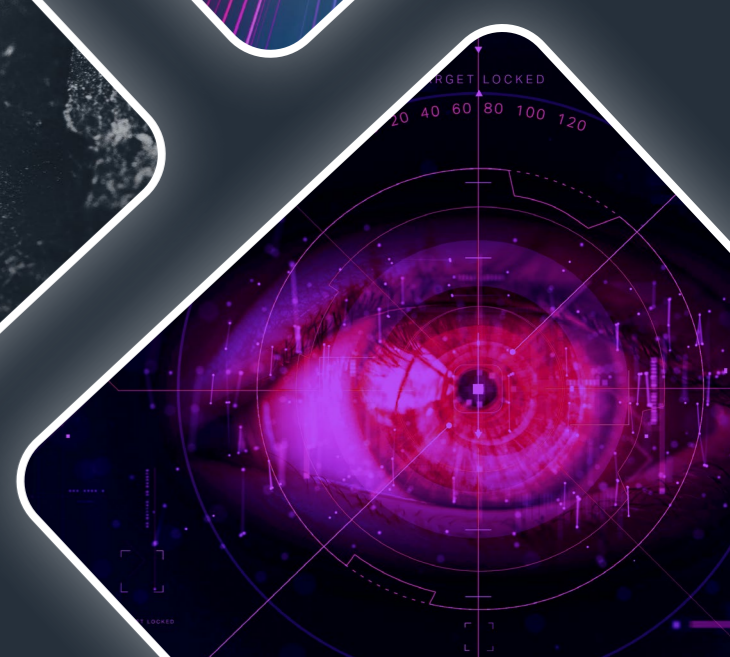
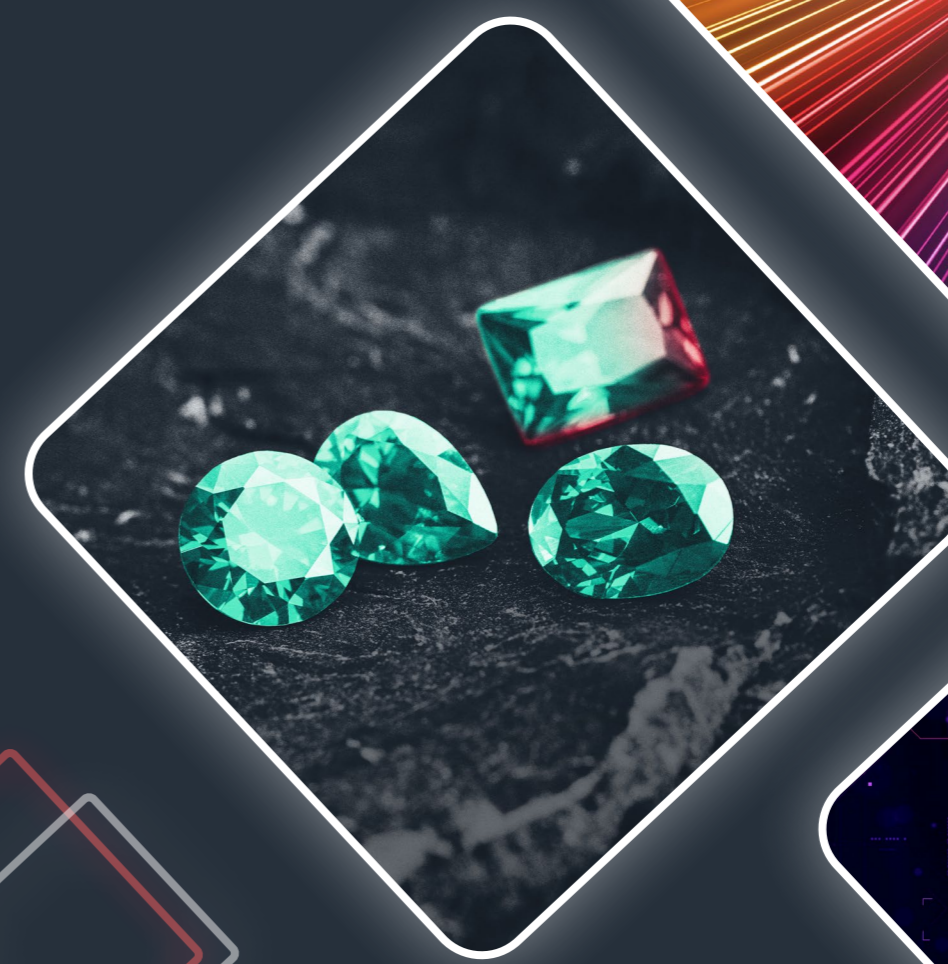
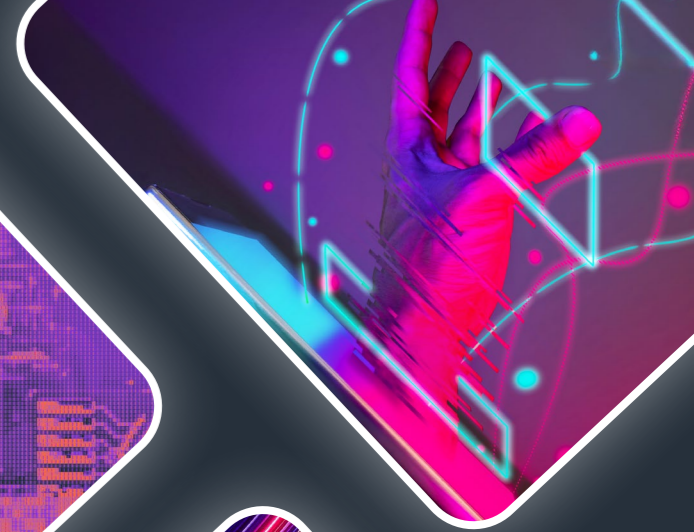

2025 was every bit as dynamic as anticipated. It presented an unpredictable landscape, shaped by ongoing geopolitical tensions, shifting trade dynamics, turbulent financial markets, and emerging disruptions in areas many of us did not foresee.

At the same time, much of our operational environment remains steady. Cyber risk continues to be highlighted as one of the world's most pressing concerns, with data breaches ranking among the most feared threats for organisations of all sizes. In response, companies are strengthening resilience through diversified supply chains, major investments in cybersecurity, enhancements to enterprise risk management, and renewed focus on business continuity capabilities. Our commitment to equipping our Members with the insight, tools, and services to confront these challenges has once again enabled us to secure a strong financial performance.

In 2025, we welcomed new organisations into the Membership, bringing us to a total of 473 Full Member organisations—53% of which are Fortune 500 or Forbes Global 2000 companies.

This continued growth, combined with industry-leading retention rates, allows us to reinvest in our capabilities and ensures our Members can continue to receive the benefits they value most.

Our research catalogue continues to earn outstanding feedback from Members, reinforcing the value and impact of the work we do together. This year, we proudly introduced 14 new research and tool products, each designed to equip our community with forward looking insight and practical guidance. Highlights include **Identity and Access Management, Leadership Insights: The C-Suite's Perspective of Cyber and Advice from the C-Suite, AI Insights: AI Security Governance, AI Ethics and Agentic AI, Women in Cyber** and cutting edge research exploring **Protecting the Crown Jewels**.

Our events continue to serve as a vibrant hub for collective intelligence. More than 1000 Members joined us for our 36th World Congress — held in Prague and broadcast globally — representing organisations from 53 countries. The energy, ideas, and openness you bring to these gatherings define the ISF community, and we are excited to foster even more meaningful collaboration in the years ahead.

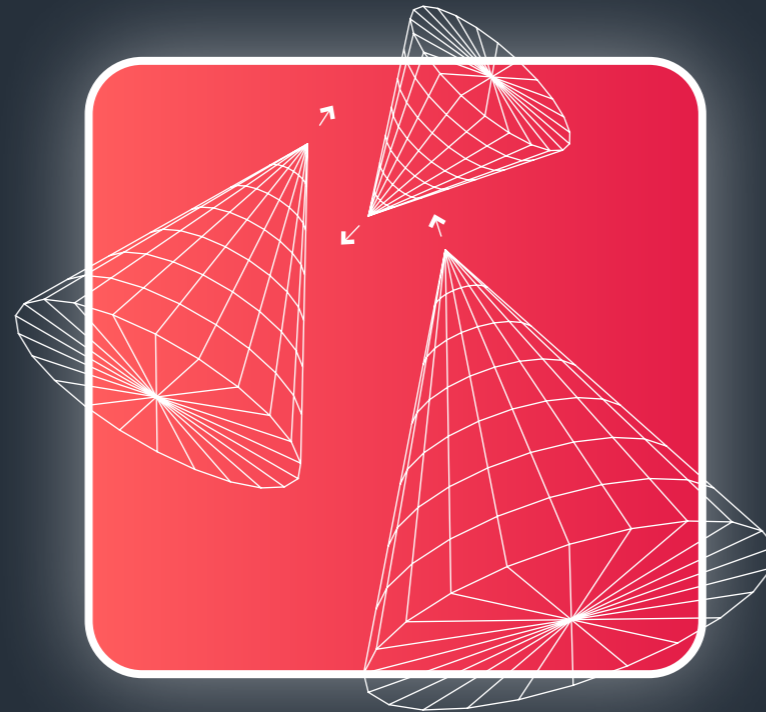
ISF is a leading, independent authority on information security and risk management.

Extending capability through ISF services (continued)



ISF provides a holistic approach designed to contribute to the resilience of organisations by addressing the following strategic aspects:

Governance

Establishes the strategic direction, organisational structure, and oversight mechanisms needed to run a resilient information security programme. This includes defining security strategy, developing implementation roadmaps, organisational design and creating governance frameworks consisting of policies, processes, procedures, guidelines, and operational playbooks.

Risk management

Provides a structured approach to identifying, assessing, and treating security risks using ISF-aligned methodologies such as **IRAM2** and other recognised standards. Services include defining risk appetite, developing a common risk management framework, profiling threats, and performing assessments including, impact analysis, risk assessments, vulnerability assessments, penetration testing, readiness checks, and supply chain reviews to ensure risks are understood and effectively mitigated.

Compliance and assurance

Supports organisations in understanding their current compliance posture and aligning with relevant standards, frameworks, regulations, and directives. It includes mapping maturity, assessing compliance against frameworks like ISF **Standard of Good Practice**, ISO/IEC 27001 series, NIST CSF, CIS, and sector-specific regulations such as NIS2 and DORA. Activities include gap analyses, compliance reviews, surveys, and internal audits to provide assurance and guide improvement.

Culture

Focuses on developing a security-aware workforce through awareness activities, simulations, and behavioural uplift. It strengthens organisational readiness by helping staff understand threats, evaluate response capabilities, identify gaps in security practices, and improve communication during crises. This includes tabletop exercises, wargames, awareness assessments, and tailored readiness simulations designed to embed a proactive and resilient security culture.

Industry insights

Industry Insights combine external intelligence, good practice frameworks, and sector specific knowledge to help organisations benchmark their maturity and evolve their resilience. By drawing on recognised standards, ISF methodologies, and emerging regulatory requirements, this pillar enables organisations to anticipate changes in the threat and regulatory landscape and continuously improve their security posture.

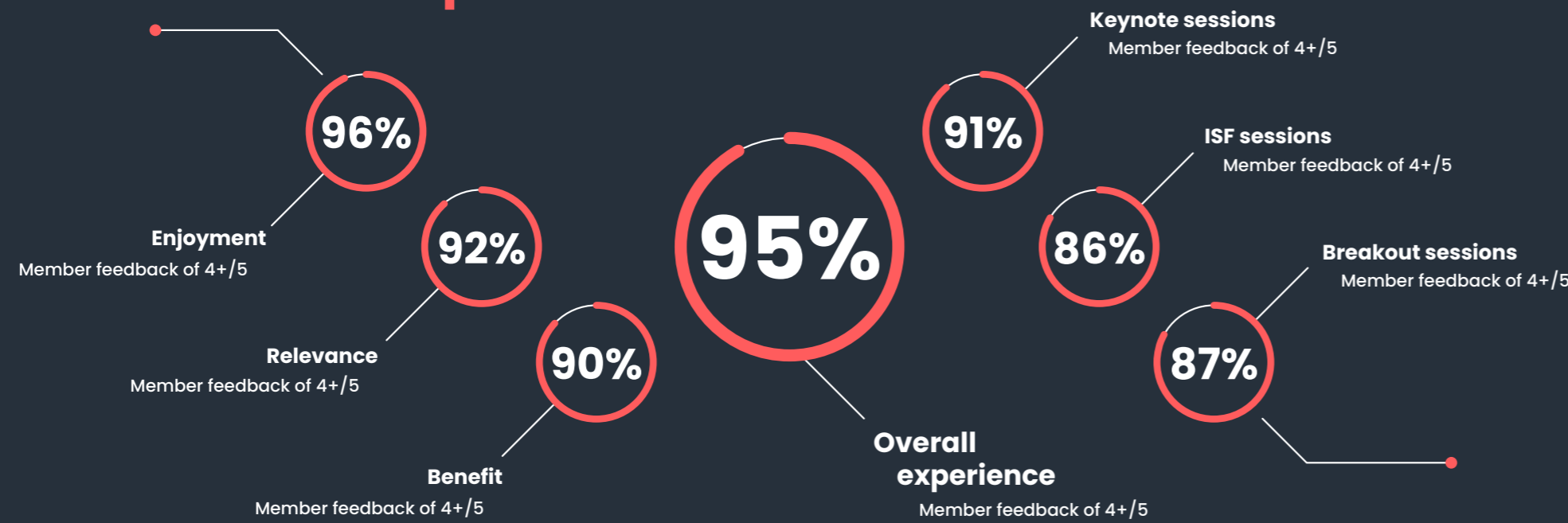
